<u>DoT Exemption</u>: To avail yourself of the DoT equipment exemption for dinghies sailing from coastal yachts clubs you must be accompanied by a safety boat otherwise you must carry the same equipment as any other boat. The equipment required under the Navigate waters Regulations includes: Flares, PFD1, anchor and bilge pump or bucket and in some areas radio and EPIRB.
